Agenda:

1. Beach Volleyball Scoreboard Project – Schematic Design.

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to review the proposal for a scoreboard at the beach volleyball facility.

At the November 15, 2024, CPC meeting the CPC voted to recommend approval of the beach volleyball court facility schematic design review. The project was brought back to the committee at the June 13, 2025 where the committee voted to recommend approval of the schematic design for a restroom and storage buildings. As the project has developed, the CPC is now being asked to review the inclusion of a scoreboard into the beach volleyball

facility located at the southeast intersection of Agate Street and 13th Avenue. Review by the CPC is required as this is a modification to the previously approved project.

The scoreboard is proposed to be located on the east side of the facility, adjacent to the restroom/storage building. The size of the scoreboard is approximately 8 feet tall x 30 feet wide.

The committee held three previous meetings related to the beach volleyball facility; restroom and storage facility on June 13, 2025, facility schematic design on November 15, 2024, and site selection on October 3, 2023. The previous meeting records are located here:

Action: The committee is being asked to determine if the **Beach Volleyball Scoreboard Project – Schematic Design** is consistent with the *Campus Plan* and to formulate a recommendation to the president. Typically, the committee takes one of the following four actions:

1. Recommends approval.
2. Recommends approval subject to a series of conditions.
3. Does not recommend approval.
4. Delays action until a future meeting

2. Campus Plan – Principle 9: Transportation Amendment - Discussion

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to discuss forthcoming proposed amendments to Principle 9 in the Campus Plan.

With the current effort by UO Transportation Services to complete the UO Transportation Plan, there is an opportunity, and need to update Campus Plan Principle 9: Transportation. Currently, the Long-Range Campus Transportation Plan (1973, rev 1976) and Bicycle Plan (1991) are subject plans, which are part of the Campus Plan but approved as separate documents. In addition, the Bicycle Management Program (2002, Rev 2003, 2021) is an implementation plan that is not part of the Campus Plan. Having three separate documents related to transportation has been a challenge to monitor and keep up to date. While it has been the intention to consolidate these three documents into the new UO Transportation Plan, much of the content in the new plan is related to operations and implementation, making it more like an implementation plan rather than a planning policy document. Campus Planning would like to discuss with the committee a proposal to amend Principle 9 to integrate relevant transportation principles from the two current subject plans and the new UO Transportation Plan, eliminate the subject plans, and establish the UO Transportation Plan as an implementation plan. The intent is to simplify our planning documents to improve clarity, increase usefulness, and maintain relevance, while allowing the UO Transportation Plan to remain agile, the purpose of which is to help Transportation Services strategically implement transportation planning principles.

UO Transportation Plan Description: Transportation Services has been working with a transportation consultant team to develop a long-range Transportation Plan for the University of Oregon. Because Transportation Services oversees transportation programs, policies, and most travel infrastructure on campus, they have taken the lead in this effort, working in very close coordination with Campus Planning and Facilities Management (CPFM). The Plan is a comprehensive long-term strategy aimed at enhancing accessibility, fostering campus vibrancy, and promoting sustainable travel options including walking, biking, and

transit use. The goal is to support safe and efficient travel needs while effectively coordinating development efforts with the surrounding community and supporting campus sustainability goals. The UO Transportation Plan will provide the university with a long-range transportation capital project list, and plan that supports multimodal connectivity, pedestrian safety, a bike-friendly campus, transit enhancements, campus green initiatives and parking management. This planning process solicited input, feedback, and ideas from the UO community, including from the Campus Planning Committee in three separate meetings. It is anticipated the project will return to the committee in March 2026 with a final plan that incorporates feedback and suggestions from the committee, campus stakeholders, and community partners.
