<u>Background:</u> The purpose of this agenda item is to review the proposed exterior site for the "Disappearing Urns" 1% for Art project. The committee's role is to determine whether the

proposed site is consistent with *Campus Plan* Principles and Patterns (e.g., location, scale, maintenance, etc.).

As described in the attached proposal, the "Disappearing Urns" consists of 3 separate masonry sculptures proposed to be sited between University and Villard Halls (West of the Old Campus Quadrangle). The sculptures were selected as part of the Heritage Project's Percent for Art responsibilities. No lighting is proposed for the sculptures.
