1. Streisinger Hall Electrical Transformer Project – Schematic Design Review

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to review the schematic design related to new electrical transformers that will be installed south of Streisinger Hall.

The project will install new electrical transformers in the courtyard between Streisinger, Klamath, and Huestis Hall to improve electrical distribution and resiliency to nearby science buildings. The new electrical transformers will improve down times during switchover and simplify sequencing of work to support research work in the nearby labs and allow for safer replacement of the units.

2. 1678 Villard Street – Proposed East Campus House Removal

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to review the proposed demolition of the house located at 1678 Villard Street, in the East Campus Area. As required by the Campus Planning Principle 1, demolition of houses within the R-1 Low Density residential zone require committee review. The house proposed for demolition is no longer used for student housing and is beyond a condition that is practical or reasonable for the required repairs. Following removal of the structure, the site will be back filled, graded, and a lawn will be established. Existing trees on the site will be preserved.

3. Knight Campus Phase 2 Exterior 1% for Art (“I Demand To See a Face” and “Uncertainty”) - Siting Review

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to review the proposed exterior site for the 1% for Art project, “I Demand To See a Face” and “Uncertainty,” at the Knight Campus Phase 2. The committee’s role is to determine whether the proposed site is consistent with *Campus Plan* Principles and Patterns (e.g. location, scale, maintenance, etc.).

As described in the attached proposal, the “I Demand To See a Face” sculpture is proposed to be sited within a landscape planter on the south terrace near the Millrace Path and bridge connecting the Knight Campus buildings. The sculpture, “Uncertainty”, is proposed to be installed within a landscape planter on the west side of the west terrace between the Knight Campus Phase 2 building and the adjacent Kiln Shed within the Urban Farm. The sculptures were selected as part of the Knight Campus Phase 2 Percent for Art responsibilities. No lighting is proposed for the sculptures.

4. UO Transportation Plan

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is for UO Transportation Services to provide an overview of the completed UO Transportation Plan for information to the committee. The UO Transportation Plan is considered an implementation plan and therefore does not require CPC review and action.

Transportation Services worked with a transportation consultant team to develop the University of Oregon Transportation Plan. Transportation Services oversees transportation programs, policies, and most travel infrastructure on campus. They have taken the lead to develop this plan working in very close coordination with Campus Planning and Facilities Management (CPFM). The Plan is a comprehensive long-term strategy aimed at enhancing accessibility, fostering campus vibrancy, and promoting sustainable travel options including walking, biking, and transit use. The goal is to support safe and efficient travel needs while effectively coordinating development efforts with the surrounding community and supporting campus sustainability goals. The UO Transportation Plan will provide the university with a long-range transportation capital project list and supports multimodal connectivity, pedestrian safety, a bike-friendly campus, transit enhancements, campus green initiatives and parking management. As discussed at the February 20, 2026, CPC meeting, the UO Transportation Plan is considered an implementation plan. Relevant portions of the Plan will be incorporated into the Campus Plan – Principle 9 as part of a future amendment.
