1. Bronze "Thinker Duck" Sculpture - Siting

<u>Background:</u> The purpose of this agenda item is to review the proposed site for a bronze "Thinker Duck" sculpture. The committee's role is to determine whether the proposed site is consistent with *Campus Plan* Principles and Patterns (e.g., location, scale, maintenance).

As described in the attached description, a "Thinker Duck" sculpture will be donated to the University by a 1980 graduate of the Lundquist College of Business. A similar sculpture currently exists at the College's UO Portland location. The proposed location in the Lillis Plaza has been selected based on the donor's connection to the Lundquist College of Business, high visibility along 13th Avenue, and compatibility with the large "O" on the Lillis facade which has become a prominent location for photos.

2. East Campus Plan Update Related to the Next Generation Housing Development Plan – Discussion

<u>Background:</u> The purpose of this agenda item is to discuss a future amendment to the East Campus Plan related to the Next Generation Housing Development Plan.

Over the next 20 years, the University of Oregon is planning more high-quality, learning-centered residential communities on campus to serve our growing student community, including first-year students, upper-division undergraduates, graduates, and families. Oncampus housing improves student performance, reduces academic costs, adds to the overall housing supply, and intentionally connects and engages students with the University of Oregon. The outcome of this work will include a long-range plan for housing and infrastructure and an update to the 2003 Development Policy for the East Campus Area (East Campus Plan).

An update to the East Campus Plan is necessary to support the Next Generation Housing Development Plan. This update is anticipated to be completed by the end of Fall term, 2024, and will be reviewed by the committee over a series of CPC meetings.
