1. UO Long Range Transportation Plan – Continued Discussion

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to hold continued discussion on the UO Long Range Transportation Plan.

Transportation Services has been working with a transportation consultant team to develop a long-range Transportation Plan for the University of Oregon. Because Transportation Services oversees transportation programs, policies, and most travel infrastructure on campus, they have taken the lead in this effort, working in very close coordination with

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Campus Planning and Facilities Management (CPFM). The Plan is a comprehensive long-term strategy aimed at enhancing accessibility, fostering campus vibrancy, and promoting sustainable travel options including walking, biking, and transit use. The goal is to support safe and efficient travel needs while effectively coordinating development efforts with the surrounding community and supporting campus sustainability goals. The UO Transportation Plan will provide the university with a long-range transportation capital project list, and plan that supports multimodal connectivity, pedestrian safety, a bike-friendly campus, transit enhancements, campus green initiatives and parking management. This planning process continues to solicit input, feedback, and ideas from the UO community, including from the Campus Planning Committee through this second informational meeting. The project will return to the committee in Fall, 2025 with a final plan that incorporates feedback and suggestions from the committee, campus stakeholders, and community partners.

The committee held two previous meetings for this agenda item on April 18, 2025 and July 26, 2024. The previous meeting records are located here:

Action: No formal action is requested.

2. CPC Chair Discussion

The CPC Chair will facilitate a discussion regarding CPC student membership composition on the committee.

At the request of the CPC chair, discuss a proposal of prioritizing 2 students from the School of Planning, Public Policy, and Management (PPPM) to serve on the committee as student representatives (1 graduate and 1 undergraduate student). The CPC charge identifies that "Membership of the Campus Planning Committee is not fixed. Typically, it shall consist of 8-10 faculty and/or Officers of Administration (minimum 5 teaching faculty), 5 students, and 1 classified staff member selected from the university at large." Prioritizing 2 of the student appointments to PPPM students would offer professional development directly related to their field of study. While changes to CPC membership are the purview of the President's Office, this agenda item is an action item because the proposal is initiated by the CPC Chair.

Action: The committee is being asked to make a recommendation to the President's Office to **prioritize two students from the School of Planning, Public Policy, and Management (one graduate and one undergraduate) to serve on the committee as student representatives**. Typically, the committee takes one of the following four actions:

1. Recommends approval
2. Recommends approval subject to a series of conditions
3. Does not recommend approval
4. Delays action until a future meeting
