2. *Campus Plan Outdoor Sign Plan – Proposal for Non-Standard Signage on Agate Hall for the Schnitzer School of Global Studies and Languages*

Background: As described in the attached project description, the Schnitzer School of Global Studies and Languages has requested banners to be installed at the entrance to Agate Hall through January 2028 while temporarily located in Agate Hall during the renovation of Friendly Hall. The banners will be removed when the school moves back to Friendly Hall at the completion of the renovation project. The request for banners is needed due to the temporary location and high volume of visitors, students, graduate employees, instructors, and various stakeholders that visit the site. Other factors that necessitate signage is that this school is in its infancy and additional signage will help promote the school and ensure its success and provide improved way finding at the temporary location rather than its typical location in the campus academic core.

All proposals for exterior signage not covered by the campus standard designs shall be reviewed according to the criteria stated in the Campus Outdoor Sign Plan and approved on a case-by-case basis in a manner authorized by the Campus Planning Committee (with exceptions noted in the plan).

Content - CPC does not regulate specific text or graphics, except that content must be related to a university event, organization, or department

- Purpose - The need for signs differing from a campus standard must be justified.
- Overall Design and Location - All signs on campus shall be compatible with the character of the campus.

3. UO School of Music & Dance Secure Bike Parking – Schematic Design Review

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to review the schematic design of a secure bike parking facility on the east side of the Frohnmyer Music Complex. The proposed location currently has an existing covered bike rack. This project proposes enclosing the

existing bike rack area for improved security for bikes and e-scooter parking with materials consistent with other bike enclosures on campus.
