Agenda:

1. Streisinger Hall Electrical Transformer Project – Schematic Design Review

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to continue the review of the schematic design related to new electrical transformers that will be installed south of Streisinger Hall.

The project will install new electrical transformers in the courtyard between Streisinger, Klamath, and Huestis Hall to improve electrical distribution and resiliency to nearby science buildings. The new electrical transformers will improve down times during switchover and simplify sequencing of work to support research work in the nearby labs and allow for safer replacement of the units.

Please refer to the attached background materials for more information. Relevant *Campus Plan* principles and patterns are described below.

The committee held one previous meeting for this agenda item on March 20, 2026, where the committee voted to delay action. The primary issues needing resolution were confirmation the siting is compatible with adjacent research activities and impacts to views are being considered. 2. Proposed Amendment to the *Campus Plan* - Principle 9: Transportation – Public Hearing and Action

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to hold a public hearing for the proposed amendments to the *Campus Plan*, Principle 9: Transportation. After the public hearing closes, the committee will review the final draft of the proposed amendments and take action.

Following the recent completion of the *Campus Transportation Plan*, there is a need to update the *Campus Plan* Principle 9: Transportation. Currently, the *Long-Range Campus Transportation Plan* (1973, rev 1976) and *Bicycle Plan* (1991) are subject plans, which are part of the *Campus Plan* but approved as separate documents. The intent of the *Campus Transportation Plan* is to be an implementation plan that provides greater detail on how to implement *Campus Plan* principles related to transportation, replacing the 1976 and 1991 subject plans. The purpose of the amendment is to simplify our planning documents to improve clarity, increase usefulness, and maintain relevance by updating *Campus Plan* – Principle 9 with relevant principles from the *Campus Transportation Plan* and eliminating the 1976 and 1991 subject plans. The amendment will also incorporate relevant principles from the *Bicycle Management Program*, which is an implementation plan and not part of the *Campus Plan*.

Campus Planning staff will provide a detailed review of the current subject plans and the proposed amendments to Principle 9 for discussion with the committee

A public hearing is required if proposed amendments result in a change to a Plan principle or substantive amendments to patterns or principle refinements. Plan amendments shall be by action of the university president upon recommendation by the Campus Planning Committee.
