GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY

FRIDAY, MARCH 2nd, 2018 - 1PM

A little more than 16 months after announcing the Phil and Penny Knight Campus for Accelerating Scientific Impact, the University of Oregon is inviting the public to celebrate breaking ground on the ambitious \$1 billion initiative.

The \$225 million, 160,000-square-foot first phase, along the north side of Franklin Boulevard between Onyx Street and Riverfront Parkway, is slated to open in early 2020. The effort to rethink research, science education and innovation is made possible by a \$500 million lead gift from Penny and Phil Knight. Funding is augmented with \$50 million in state bonds approved in 2017 .



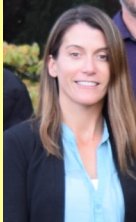

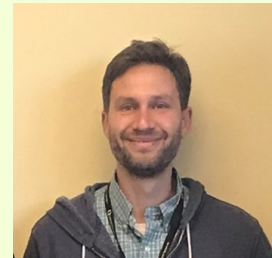

Glen MacDonald from Design & Construction, has recently installed a camera to view the Osprey nest that towers atop the Law School. The Osprey nest was relocated from the top of a light pole at Hayward Field, then moved to a perch located on top of the Knight Law building in March 2014. The location on top of the Law School is safer for the birds, away from lightning and the crowds at Hayward Field. Last year, the Law School received donor funding to install the camera so a live stream of the Osprey couple could be shared at all times. The Osprey should arrive in late March and continue their stay through October. We're patiently awaiting their arrival!

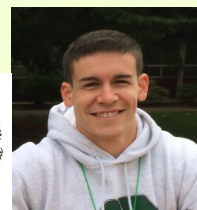

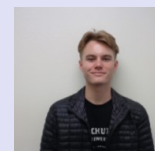

AiM Update – April 1st Go-live is fast approaching and we're very busy wrapping-up the Issues List items. You should be hearing soon about upcoming training.

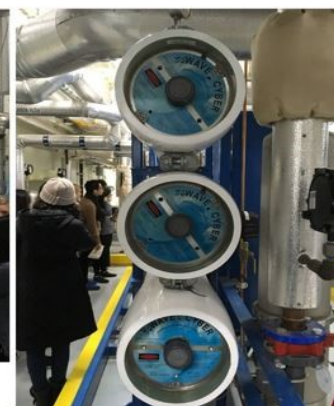
