

Very studious faces on the core leadership folks while Tiffany Lundy, learning and development manager, directs groups into discussions about supervisory styles.


### Assetworld:21


Some of the conference highlights included using work orders to track administrative projects, leveraging action codes, solving business problems with AIM automation, new work desk launch and the new Team Scheduler.

### UO Waste & Recycling Report



The Office of Sustainability compiled this report on UO's waste diversion efforts. Led by Zero Waste, UO achieved a 57% waste diversion effort this past year! That translates to roughly 112 pounds of trash and 149 pounds of recycled and reused materials per faculty/staff/student last year. Our recycling rate has been climbing steadily since 1993 and has become a deep point of pride for the UO community. We're sharing the report with all CPFM staff since it's clear that so many of you play important roles in our successful waste reduction and diversion efforts. Special thanks to Design and Construction, Landscaping and Grounds maintenance, Maintenance Support, and the Mobile Shop for your programmatic commitments to reduce, re-use, and recycling. Other key campus partners include Business Affairs, Dining Services, Housing, and Environmental Health and Safety.
