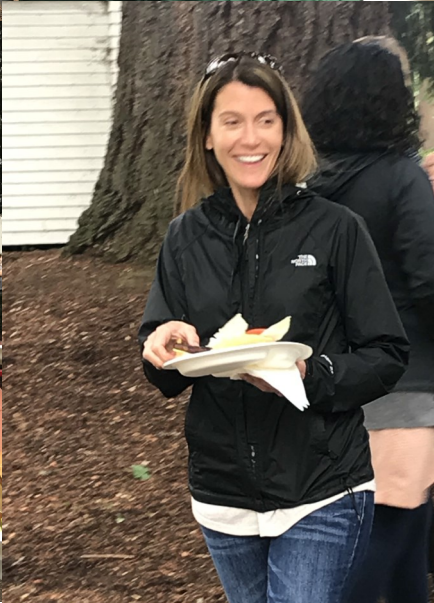

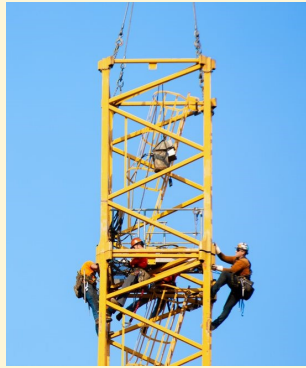

Knight Campus for Accelerated Scientific Impact has reached a few major milestones over the last month. Most notably is the tower crane which will be heavily utilized to move material staged in the western half of Lot 4 to the jobsite for erection of the building. Additionally, we have reached the end of the major excavation work, including the removal of 6-8 feet of rock; we have successfully removed all of the petroleum contaminated soils; drained out mid-construction water feature which acquired numerous names over the course of its existence; completed the shoring and have poured the first structural concrete on the project. In upcoming months, we will start to see the concrete structure rise out of the ground and the two towers of the building will start to take shape. CHARLENE LINDSAY RETIRES AFTER 22 YEARS WITH UO

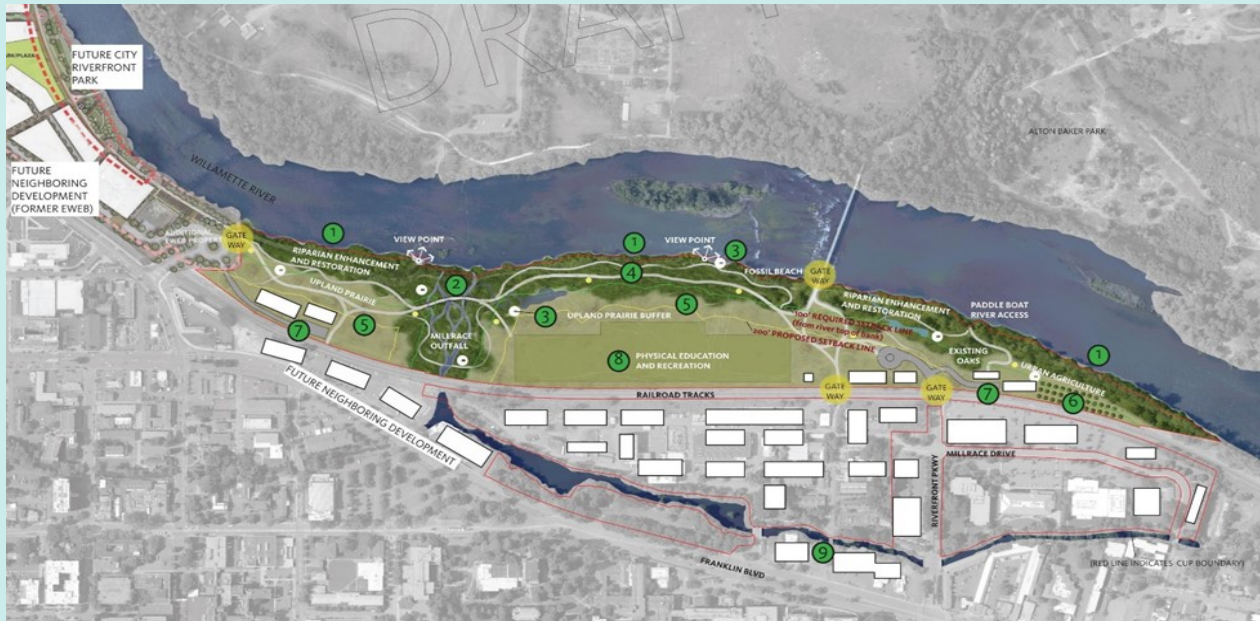

NORTH CAMPUS CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT UPDATE

The City of Eugene held a public hearing for the University's North Campus CUP application on Wednesday, September 12th. Representing the university from CPFM were AVP Mike Harwood and Senior Planner Emily Eng, along with the project's land use consultant and attorney. Also attending were members of the project team. The hearing lasted 3 hours, including about 2 hours of public testimony. Speaking in support of the university's application were Steve Mital (Office of Sustainability), Chief Matthew Carmichael (UOPD), Brent Harrison (PE&REC), Dean Livelybrooks (Physics, Campus Planning Committee), Michelle Emmons (Willamette Riverkeeper), and Andy Vobora (Travel Lane County), who highlighted the CUP's commitment to conservation and potential to facilitate an enhanced, safe, and active riverfront that meets the university's needs and connects people to the river. A number of community members spoke in opposition of the proposal, primarily citing concerns about the possibility of artificial turf recreation fields and the desire to keep the land north of the railroad tracks undeveloped. The hearings official is holding the record open until October 3 to allow for additional public comments. A decision is anticipated by November 1, followed by a 2-week appeal period. Open enrollment will be here soon

Open Enrollment is an annual event that gives you the opportunity to review benefit offerings and select the same options or change your elections for the following year. Open Enrollment is mandatory. You are required to take action even if you will be making no changes to your current elections. Open Enrollment begins on October 1, and your deadline for taking action is October 31.
