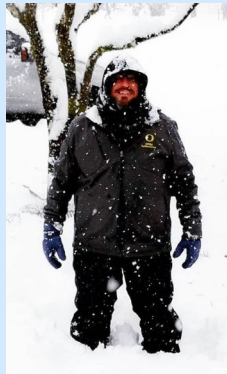
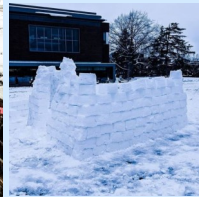

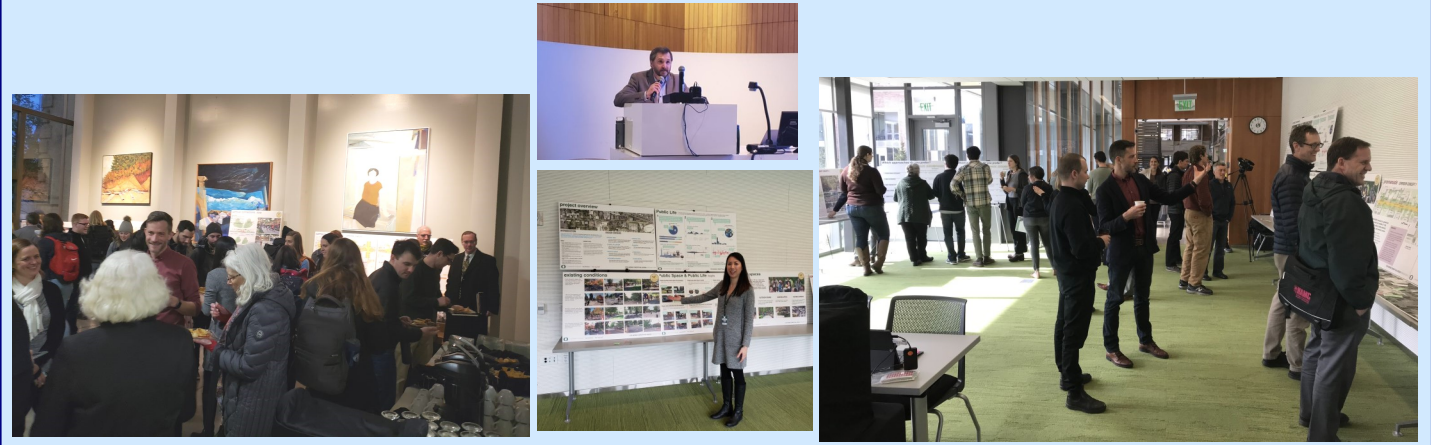

13th AVENUE OPEN HOUSE AND GEHL PUBLIC LECTURE

On February 7th, **Aaron Olsen** and the Campus Planning team hosted an Open House showcasing two conceptual ideas for the 13th Avenue Conceptual Design Project. The event was an opportunity for UO staff, students, faculty and community members to see what the project design team has been working on and provide input. The designs on display were presented so visitors could see the range of possible options and comment on various aspects of each one. The team will be compiling this information and incorporating the feedback into their final design, which is expected to be complete by June this year. The event was well attended and informative feedback was received from all, including many CPFM folks. Following the open house, Blaine Merker from Gehl Studio, a project sub-consultant, presented a thought provoking lecture about Public Life and how data is being used to transform the world's most livable cities.

SOME INFORMATION RE: INTERDEPARTMENTAL MAIL:

Printing and Mailing delivers the interdepartmental mail to CPFM twice a day at 10:30AM and 2:30PM.

When preparing an interdepartmental mailing, be sure everything is crossed out above your entry.

The name of the department must be listed. If not visible, the envelope is dropped off at the front desk to track down this information, and then won't be picked up until the next time they stop by.

Spare interdepartmental envelopes are located in the window of the mailroom in the CPFM Admin building. If you have extra available, please place them in the window.

All mail and shipments sent through Mail Services must be University related business only. If it is personal, you will need to drop it off at a mailbox. The nearest blue USPS mailbox is located at 1395 University St (W of EMU). The closest post office (mailing station) is at Hiron's Drug Store at 1950 Franklin Blvd (E of Matt Knight Arena). Other blue USPS mailbox locations around campus are: 1300 Alder (1 block W of Condon Hall), 1515 Agate (NW of Knight Law), 1200 Hilyard (West of Sacred Heart), 1200 Kincaid (W of Computing Center), 1500 Kincaid (W of Knight Library), 2055 Patterson (E of South Eugene High), 722 E. 11th (N of Sacred Heart), 1495 E. 19th (1 block S of Agate Apartments).
