OPAL WHITELEY

Many thanks to the exceptional talent of Ellen Tykesen who created the sculpture of Opal Whiteley as a child. Opal Whiteley was born December 11, 1897 in Colton Washington and relocated to Walden Oregon, near Cottage Grove, in 1904. She was a renowned writer at a young age and attended the University of Oregon beginning in 1916.

The sculpture is located on the Northeast corner of the Knight Library. The project sponsors were Mike Andreasen, Mike Harwood and Jeff Butler. The project team was a collection of contractors and internal staff, which included: Aaron Olson of Planning did the conceptual design. David Cates and Nathan Chaffee in Design and Construction created the construction design. The GC, Tim Gribble of Preferred Construction, coordinated the construction and sculpture installation. The concrete subcontractor, Scott Brown of Brown Construction, did the concrete installation. Rexius did the irrigation installation. Rob Berg and Brandon Flock of Facilities did the electrical work. Phil Carroll and Jane Brubaker of Facilities did the plantings.
