### Annual CPFM Spring Teambuilding Night Bowling Event at Emerald Lanes





Raised on the Standing Rock Reservation in North Dakota, Luger is a New Mexico based multi-disciplinary artist who invites us to engage with indigenous Peoples and values.

People have been living in Oregon for more than 14,000 years. The stories of these first Americans are partly revealed through archeological collections from the state's high desert caves. These sagebrush bark sandals were recovered by archeologist, Luther Cressman in Fort Rock Cave, and are over 10,000 years old.
