Smoke Free Campus Report:

- Stephanie Franklin summarized the proposed Campus Smoke Free plan development process
- The task force will recommend the campus go smoke free
- If accepted an implementation committee will deal with the logistical issues of the policy and its enforcement during the 2009-10 academic year.

Discussion

The committee reviewed the positive arguments presented by the task force and expressed a number of concerns regarding the recommendation, including:

- How can this policy be enforced? If it cannot, how is it different than the current policy?
- Will this create tension between classified and un-classified staff? Classified staff do not have the same flexibility as un-classified staff regarding breaks.
- Is there a way to do this without pushing people off campus and onto neighbors?
- How does this infringe upon personal health choices? What are the social implications?
- How is the campus area defined? Does it include the stadium? The downtown center?
- How does the health impact of outdoor second-hand smoke compare to other, outdoor air pollutants?
- Is the University's role only to educate about health issues or also to control behaviors?

A motion was made to endorse the Smoke-Free Campus Recommendation. It was seconded. Three members voted for it and six voted against. The EIC is not endorsing the smoke-free campus policy. Additional topics on the agenda will be covered in future EIC meetings.
