**1. CPC Updates – CPC Preferred Meeting Times Survey Results**

## **2. Phil and Penny Knight Campus for Accelerating Scientific Impact (KCASI) Phase 2 – Meeting One**

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to hold Meeting One for the Phil and Penny Knight Campus for Accelerating Scientific Impact (KCASI) Phase 2.

As part of Meeting One (further described in the *Campus Plan* on page 19), the committee is asked to complete the following tasks:

- User Group - Review the proposed user group representation and provide comments to the CPC chair, who appoints group members (refer to page 12 of the *Campus Plan* for more information about user groups).
- Key Principles and Patterns - Identify key principles, patterns, and other appropriate campus design issues from the *Campus Plan*.
- Other Campus-wide Opportunities - Identify potential opportunities to address campus-wide needs within the subject area or opportunities to cooperate with other nearby development efforts.

As described in the attached project description, KCASI Phase 2 is envisioned as a research building that is approximately 175,000 GSF, standing 4 stories above grade, with a basement. The proposed site is west of Riverfront Parkway between the Millrace to the south and Millrace Drive to the North. This second building in the Knight Campus complex will further bioengineering and applied science research activity with the goal of supporting at least another 15-20 individual research programs and shared research equipment and service facilities.

Following Meeting One and final approval from the president, the project's User Group will be established and will consider the identified key policies, patterns and issues during the project design process. The User Group will present the proposed schematic design to the Campus Planning Committee for its formal review to ensure that the design is consistent with key policies and patterns.

Action: The committee is being asked to:

1. Comment on the proposed user group representation.
2. Identify key *Campus Plan* policies and patterns for the Project.
3. Identify other appropriate campus design issues and opportunities.

### **3. *Campus Plan* Amendment: Related to the area southeast of the Jaqua Triangle Design Area – Introduction and Discussion**

Background: The purpose of this agenda item is to have an initial discussion on the draft *Campus Plan* Amendment to incorporate the university's land southeast of the Jaqua Triangle Design Area into the *Campus Plan*. As described in the attached project description, currently the area southeast of the Jaqua Triangle Design Area, including the Matthew Knight Arena and the Ford Alumni Center, is not incorporated into the *Campus Plan* because it was previously not within the official campus boundary. The land was purchased to accommodate development of the Matthew Knight Arena and the Ford Alumni Center. The campus boundary was amended in 2021 to include university-owned land that had not yet been incorporated into the plan (please see the 2021 *Campus Plan* Amendment – North of Franklin Boulevard: <https://cpfm.uoregon.edu/campus-plan-amendment>).
