# **FASS—HR Updates**

The University of Oregon initiated a hiring freeze effective March 19, 2020. It applies to any potential employee of the University, including temporary, graduate (GE), and student employees. The freeze affects not only future hires, but recruitments currently in progress up to the point of a verbal offer being extended to the finalist. If an offer had been extended by the time the announcement was made, those searches will be allowed to conclude. Right now, unit AVPs are working with search chairs and hiring managers to determine if they will submit open recruitments for an exception from their respective Vice President. If you are currently on a search committee, you should know within the next week or two what the decision will be regarding your search.
