Friendly Hall is the third oldest extant building of the University of Oregon (built in 1893). The building is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places and is a primary ranked historic resource for the university.

# 2. UO Long Range Transportation Plan - Check-in & Discussion

<u>Background</u>: The purpose of this agenda item is to check-in and discuss the UO Long Range Transportation Plan.

Transportation Services has been working with a transportation consultant team to develop a long-range Transportation Plan for the University of Oregon. Because Transportation Services oversees transportation programs, policies, and most travel infrastructure on campus, they have taken the lead in this effort, working in very close coordination with Campus Planning and Facilities Management (CPFM). The Plan is a comprehensive long-term strategy aimed at enhancing accessibility, fostering campus vibrancy, and promoting sustainable travel options including walking, biking, and transit use. The goal is to support safe and efficient travel needs while effectively coordinating development efforts with the surrounding community and supporting campus sustainability goals. The UO Transportation Plan will provide the university a long-range transportation capital project list, and plan that supports multimodal connectivity, pedestrian safety, a bike-friendly campus, transit enhancements, campus green initiatives and parking management. This planning process continues to solicit input, feedback, and ideas from the UO community, including from the

Campus Planning Committee through this second informational meeting. The project will return to the committee in Fall, 2025 with a final plan that incorporates feedback and suggestions from the committee, campus stakeholders, and community partners.
