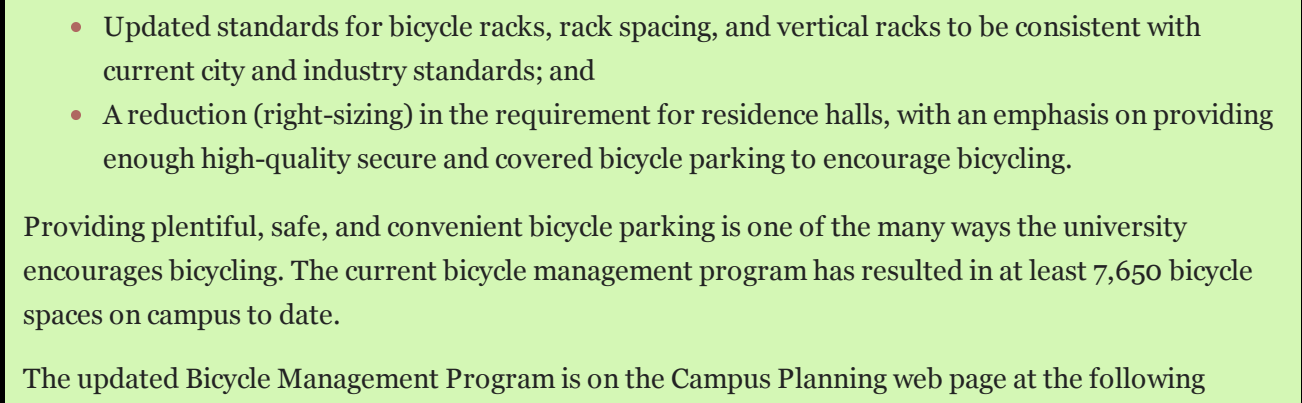

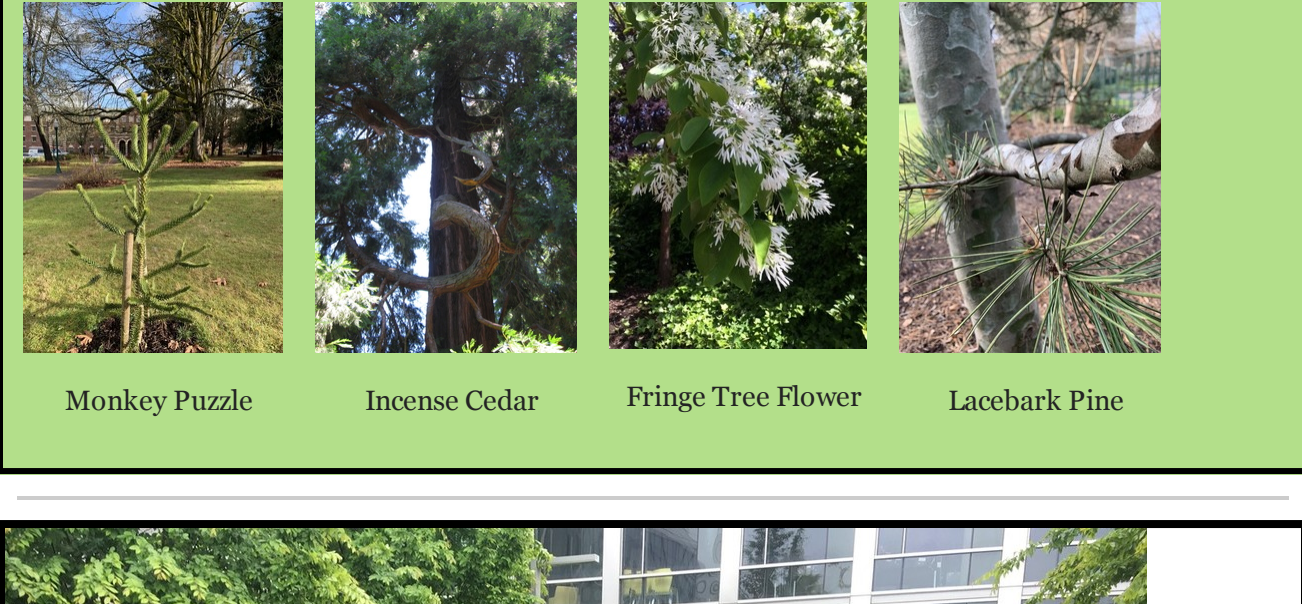
## CPFM Cleanup

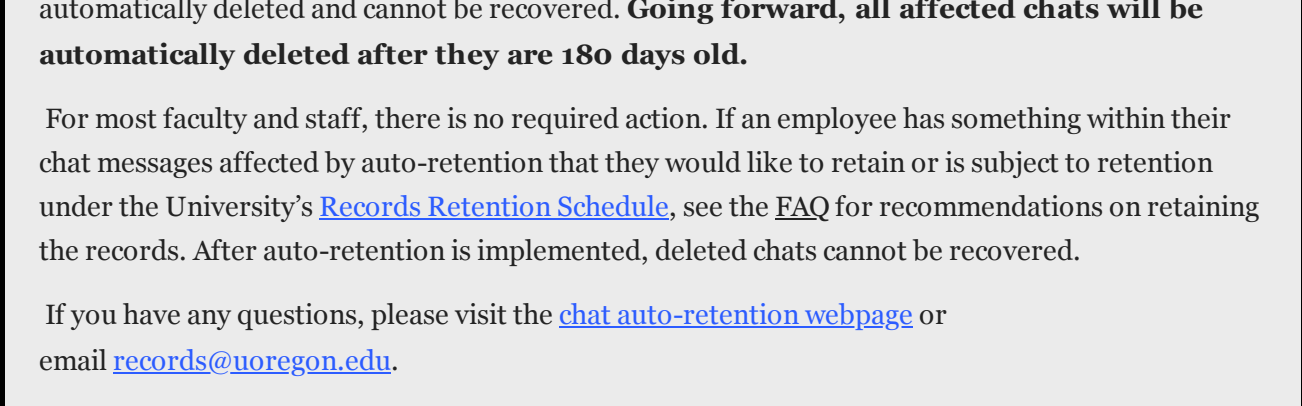
## Fiber Optic Install for Tunnel Security Project

Utilities & Energy pulled 8000 feet of fiber optic cable from the Central Power Station (CPS) to Oregon Hall, to LLC, to Tykeson Hall, to Allen Hall, then back to CPS. This is part of the ongoing tunnel security project that will help make our tunnel system more secure. ## Bicycle Management Program Updated

The university's Bicycle Management Program has been updated and approved by the City of Eugene. This is an implementation plan that regulates the quantity, location, and type of bicycle parking on campus. Originally adopted in 2002, it is one of the few campus planning documents that requires city land use approval. The purpose of the update was to respond to changes in conditions and needs, clarify language, and further simplify processes.

- Key changes include:
- Updated standards for bicycle racks, rack spacing, and vertical racks to be consistent with current city and industry standards; and
  - A reduction (right-sizing) in the requirement for residence halls, with an emphasis on providing enough high-quality secure and covered bicycle parking to encourage bicycling.

Providing plentiful, safe, and convenient bicycle parking is one of the many ways the university encourages bicycling. The current bicycle management program has resulted in at least 7,650 bicycle spaces on campus to date.

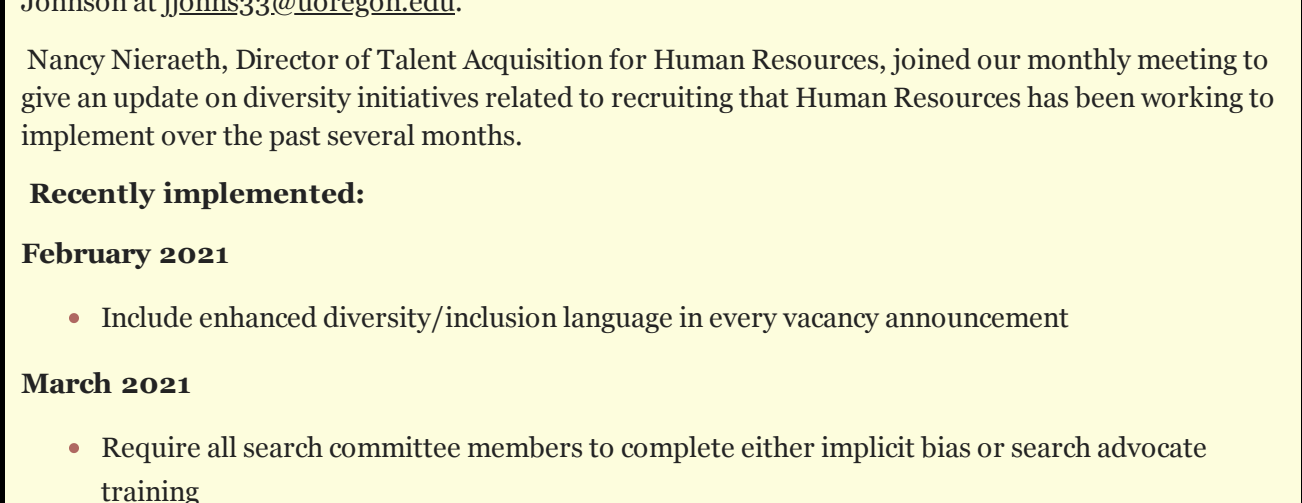
## Campus Tree Apps & Tour

## Chat Retention Implementation

On June 30, the auto-retention process will be implemented for all students, faculty, and staff. Any chats affected by this project that are 180 days or older (sent before January 1, 2021) will be automatically deleted and cannot be recovered. **Going forward, all affected chats will be automatically deleted after they are 180 days old.**

For most faculty and staff, there is no required action. If an employee has something within their chat messages affected by auto-retention that they would like to retain or is subject to retention under the University's [Records Retention Schedule](#), see the FAQ for recommendations on retaining the records. After auto-retention is implemented, deleted chats cannot be recovered.

### Recently implemented:

- February 2021**
- Include enhanced diversity/inclusion language in every vacancy announcement
- March 2021**
- Require all search committee members to complete either implicit bias or search advocate training
  - Post every new job in at least two additional diversity-focused channels with the help of JobElephant
  - Redact names and pronouns from candidate application materials

### In Progress:

- Develop data that tracks how applicant pools for VPFA searches compare to market availability data related to diversity
